

**Summer Reading Assignment for
English 1, English 2, English 3,
Practical Skills and Communications
EL English 1, 2, and 3**

Select a FICTION book of your choice! You will need to read ONE book appropriate to your age, grade, and reading level.

When selecting a book that's a good fit for reading, use the "I PICK" process to help.

- Purpose: Why do I want to read this book? What's my purpose for reading (information, enjoyment, certain genre or author)?
- Interest: Does this book/topic interest me? What's my prior knowledge on this topic, author or genre?
- Comprehension: Do I understand what I am reading? Do I have a sense of the story as I read the back cover and flip through a few pages? Do I understand the book as I start reading?
- Knowledge: Do I know and understand most of the words that I am reading?

You may NOT choose a book that you have read before.

Complete the attached Reading Log assignment, due **Friday, August 24.**

Remember that books are available at the Lakewood Public Library!

Assignment: Assignment: While reading the book, your task will be to complete a MINIMUM OF TEN (10) Double-Sided Journal entries, dividing the book into approximately four (4) sections and writing an entry for each.

Requirements for the journal entries are as follows:

- Include the title and author of your book
- Include the date of each entry and the page numbers to which each entry is responding
- Each entry should include one direct quote from the text that you feel is *significant to the book's development of character, motif, theme, setting, conflict, etc.* Include the page number from where you found the quote.
- Write at least one complete and detailed paragraph for each entry (5-8 sentences) *explaining how the chosen passage is significant.* **THIS IS NOT A SUMMARY.**

ALL WORK MUST BE SUBMITTED ON THE DUE DATE AND MAY BE EITHER TYPED OR HAND-WRITTEN NEATLY

Double-Sided Journal Response: Recreate this double-entry journal on your own and use this format for the assignment:

Directions: On the left side of the paper, you will record a **significant quote or passage** from book (along with its chapter and page number). On the right side, you will record **your response** to this passage (5-7 sentences). Your response should *not simply summarize* the passage; *it should explain* the passage's **significance** and at least one of the following **connections**:

Text-to-self: A connection between the text and your own life experiences.

Text-to-text: A connection between the passage and another text you have read previously.

Text-to-world: A connection between the text and something occurring in our world today (or something that has occurred in our recent past). Complete your entries in a similar format as shown below:
