We use the natural skills of our staff to teach school expectations and to coach our students to exemplify the competencies found in our Vision of a Lakewood Graduate. Emerson believes in acknowledging students for excellent leadership choices because each choice contributes to our positive culture. Earning a golden coin to Emerson's Book Experience is positively an

ultimate award.



We value the uniqueness of every student and believe that every child exhibits leadership qualities in different ways. i-READY GRADES 2-5

There is a district expectation that students will complete practice lessons each week. The number of lessons will vary based on the needs of each student and be determined by the classroom teacher. These lessons are targeted to the specific skills the student needs to be successful at the next level of learning. YOU CAN DO IT:)

SOME REMINDERS ABOUT DISMISSAL AND THE CAR LINE

Dismissal

- Stagger dismissal from classrooms to avoid large gatherings and heavy hallway traffic.
- Picking up at the doors allows families to avoid the car line
 - o 2:55 Kindergarten dismissed to parents at Jackson glass doors
 - 3:00 Walkers dismissed
 - o 3:05 Car Rider line begins
 - Display the car line sign in your car window every day. This keeps the line moving, especially when dismissal staff needs to adjust.
 - Please pull up all the way to the stop sign.
 - Please remain in the car and have students enter on the passenger side
 - Please be patient. The line is doubling. Our goal is to exit students as safely and efficiently as possible.
 - Please do not turn left into the parking lot (right turn only) and please do not block neighbors driveways
- Maximize different walking doors for exit. See your teachers at these doors.
 - 2:55 Kindergarten at Jackson glass doors
 - 3:00 1st grade at Jackson glass doors
 - 3:00 2nd-3rd grade at Clifton doors
 - 3:00 4th-5th grade at second set of Jackson doors
 - Older siblings should meet up at the door of younger siblings
- Avoid large gatherings for waiting. Maintain social distancing
- Masks remain on until the student has left campus or is in a car.

DISTRICT MESSAGES

March 5 & 8: Grab-and-Go Meal Delivery

On Friday, March 5 (Gold cohort) and Monday, March 8 (Purple cohort), Nutrition Services staff will provide students the meals they would otherwise receive on Tuesday, March 9 and Wednesday, March 10 as cafeterias will be closed to students that day.

March 9: Independent Learning Day

The majority of our staff is due to receive the second dose of the coronavirus vaccination on Tuesday, March 9. As was done on February 16 when staff received their first dose, *all students will have an independent or asynchronous learning day on March 9*. Teachers will provide students with assignments to complete from home.

March 10: Purple Remote Learning Day with Contingency Plan

All students in the Purple cohort will engage in remote learning following their regular school schedule. In the event that any staff members suffer post-vaccine reactions that prevent them from teaching, they will communicate this with families and leave an alternative asynchronous assignment for students. All students in the Gold cohort, Remote 2.0 and eLearning should continue with their regular schedule.

March 11 & 12

Classes will resume in our hybrid/partial return model. March 11 (Gold) and March 12 (Purple).

March 15: Fourth-Quarter Learning Plan Begins

All in-person students will begin attending school everyday, Monday through Friday, following their regular school schedule. Remote 2.0 students will continue to follow their regular schedules. eLearning students will continue as they have been. A summary of building safety protocols are below:

- The District has purchased plexiglass shields for both students and staff.
- Mask wearing remains mandatory.
- Varied classrooms sizes mean some will have 3 feet instead of 6 feet spacing.
- Buildings have made adjustments in their cafeterias to maximize spacing during lunch.
- Buildings are equipped with hospital grade air filters and pull in more outside air to reduce the amount of recirculated air.
