Lakewood City Schools provides extensive supports for our students' social-emotional health. This focus on the students' well-being is another example of Lakewood City Schools' focus on education for the whole child.



Fiscal Stewardship

An investment in education is one for the future of our community, and we deliver a high return. Lakewood City Schools provides an exceptional value for our community by being efficient and financially responsible while maintaining the expected academic excellence. We have received the Auditor of the State Award for Financial Reporting for seven straight years.

As part of the federal government's multiple pandemic aid and relief programs (commonly referred to as ESSER funds), Lakewood City Schools will receive a total of \$17.1 million spread over four years to address learning and operational needs directly impacted by the pandemic. This additional funding is earmarked to boost our learning opportunities, technology and STEM resources, and staff support for our students across all grades.
