We also have our Vision of a Lakewood Educator, which highlights the critical skills that all of our educators strive to demonstrate in relation to each competency in order to make our vision for our students a reality.



ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The educational success of our students is paramount to the overall health of our schools. We believe that success begins with our teachers, 99% of whom have been designated as "Highly Qualified" according to the Ohio Department of Education. While student success begins with dedicated faculty, it continues with the multitude of opportunities for the academic growth our students enjoy. We not only strive for excellence in our own community but aim to prepare students for achievement beyond their time with Lakewood City Schools as well.

All buildings have makerspaces/STEM programs with dedicated STEM educators. Our middle School Project Lead the Way program includes Green Architecture, App Creators, and Automation and Robotics.

Early Childhood Education

The Early Childhood Education Program has been a successful part of our community since 1990. We aim to pave the way for future success through a strong early foundation. Options for students ages 3-6 include full-day classes with before and afterschool care or a half-day classes. A sliding fee scale means every child has an opportunity to enroll.


FISCAL STEWARDSHIP

An investment in education is one for the future of our community, and we deliver a high return. Lakewood City Schools provides an exceptional value for our community by being efficient and financially responsible while maintaining the expected academic excellence. We have received the Auditor of the State Award for Financial Reporting for eight straight years.

As part of the federal government's multiple pandemic aid and relief programs (commonly referred to as ESSER funds), Lakewood City Schools will receive a total of \$17.1 million spread over four years to address learning and operational needs directly impacted by the pandemic. This additional funding is earmarked to boost our learning opportunities, technology and STEM resources, and staff support for our students across all grades.
