Course Requirements

- English Language Arts 4 credits
- Mathematics 4 credits (must include Algebra 2)
- Science 3 credits (must include Physical & Life)
- Social Studies 3 credits (must include American History & Government)
- Health $\frac{1}{2}$ credit
- PE $\frac{1}{2}$ credit (PE Waiver Option)
- Electives 5 credit (Foreign Language for College Prep)
- Fine Art 1 credit (Excluded if following a career-tech pathway)

Total: 21 credits

Assessment Requirements

- **House Bill 487** updated Ohio's graduation requirements to ensure that all students are ready for success in college and work.
- As a result, this year's current 11th graders will be the last class to take the Ohio Graduation Tests (OGTs).
- The class of 2018 and beyond will now be assessed in the following areas:

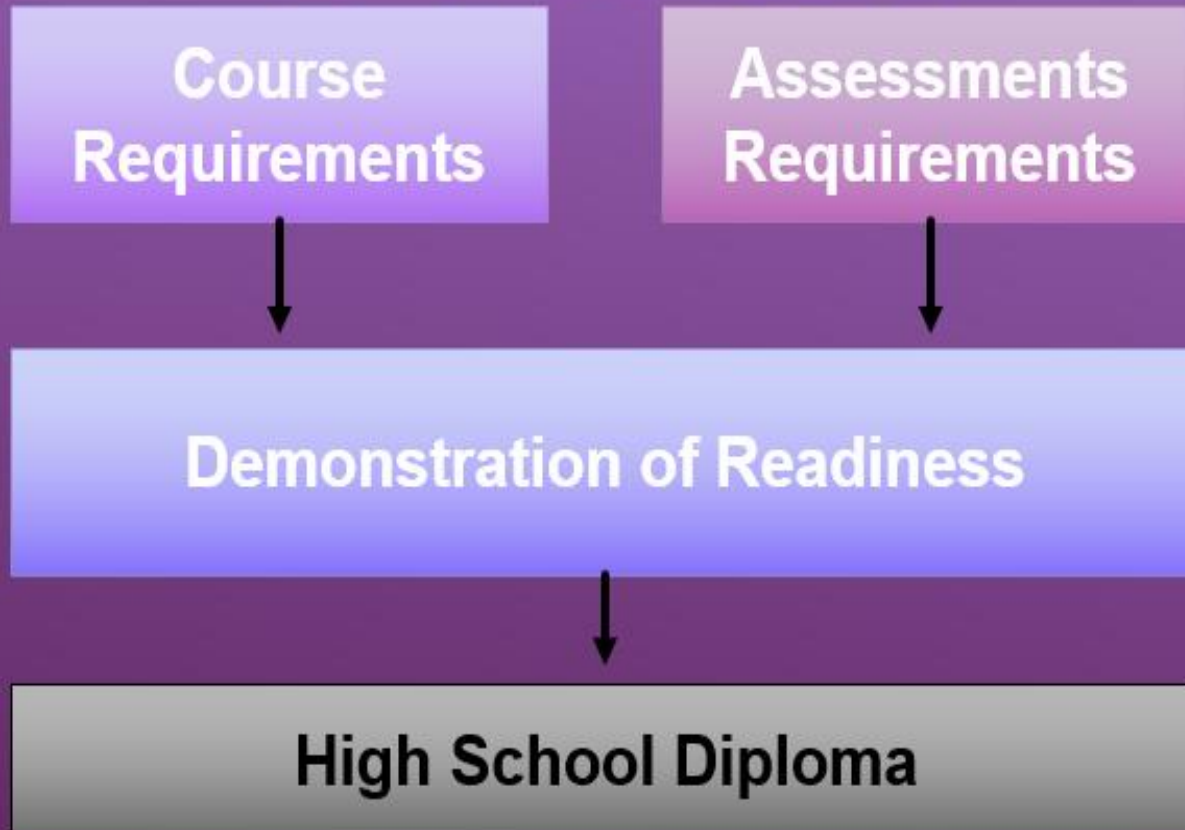

Grade Level Promotion Policy

The minimum credits needed for homeroom class designation/ privileges are:

- **Freshman** (9th Grade) = **0-4 credits** completed
- **Sophomore** (10th Grade) = minimum of **5 credits** completed
- **Junior** (11th Grade) = minimum of **10 credits** completed
- **Senior** (12th Grade) = minimum of **14 credits** completed

Criteria for Diploma with Honors

Students need to fulfill all but one criterion for any of the following Diplomas with Honors

PE Waiver

- Students who complete **two full seasons of participation** on an interscholastic athletic team, marching band or cheerleading qualify to have their participation in physical education classes waived as part of their graduation requirements.
- A waiver form must be signed and turned into the Athletic Office.
- Some cautions ...
 - Some sports have cuts
 - Injuries or other unplanned situations that come up

Athletic Eligibility

- HS eligibility starts the 4th quarter of 8th grade year.
- To be eligible, a student-athlete must be currently enrolled in an OHSAA member school and have received passing grades in a minimum of 5 one-credit courses, or the equivalent, in the immediately preceding grading period.
- In addition, OHSAA requires that students must maintain a minimum GPA of 1.0 with no more than one F and no outstanding incomplete grades.

College Credit Plus

- Students who test college ready have the ability to earn college credits while in High School.
