Sociology

The Sociology course is designed to give the 11th and 12th Grade students the tools necessary to concentrate on the systematic Study of the human society and human interaction. Students will develop a sociological mentality in which they will observe the connections between their personal lives within society and their personal connection to public policy issues. The students will use observation, the scientific method and cross cultural examination to discover how patterns of behavior develop, culture is learned and social predictions of the future are developed. The course is designed to facilitate the understanding of the information presented in the core classes of World History, U.S. History and Government and Economics.
