Registration Procedure

Registration forms are available from all high school and middle school counselors, at the Lakewood High School Bookroom and on the Lakewood City Schools website. Each student must have a registration form signed by their parent and counselor in order to register.

For non-Lakewood students, it is the responsibility of the student to make sure their home school will accept and award high school credit for summer school classes. **Please bring written approval from the student's guidance counselor to confirm course selection and possible credit.**

High school and middle school students may register at the Lakewood High School Bookroom which is located at 14100 Franklin Boulevard, near the North Visitor Entrance.

Tuition

Tuition must be paid in full at the time of registration. Payment may be made in the form of cash, VISA or MasterCard. No personal checks will be accepted.

As summer school is self-sustaining, meaning that receipts from tuition offset course costs, we reserve the right to cancel any class due to insufficient enrollment. All courses are offered on a minimum enrollment basis. Class cancellations will be communicated as soon as possible, and a refund check will be issued by the Lakewood Board of Education. Please allow at least two (2) weeks for processing. Refunds will be made only if a class is cancelled.

Students who withdraw from a class within the first two (2) days of either term will receive a refund less \$5.00 per day for administrative expenses. **No refunds will be issued for withdrawal after the second day of instruction.**

General Rules

All summer school students are expected to comply with the Lakewood Board of Education discipline policy and the laws of the state of Ohio. A copy of the policy is posted in the Summer School office area. The administration has the right to remove a student from the summer school program, without refund, for discipline and/or attendance reasons. General rules will be discussed at the opening assembly.

Attendance Policy

Students assume the risk of change in their personal affairs or health. No partial credit is allowed for any course. There are **NO excused absences** in the summer school program. Students enrolled in a 5-week course may not miss more than 2 days of school. Students enrolled in a 3-week course may not miss more than 1 day of school. Three (3) tardies equal one absence—a student will be counted tardy if he/she is late to school or after a class break. Tardy over 10 minutes equals a 1/2 day absence. If a student is withdrawn from class for poor attendance, he/she will receive an "F" grade and no money will be refunded. Exceptions will **NOT** be made for summer camps or vacations.

Required forms for use of technology and access to the district computer network will be provided at registration. Forms will be collected on the first day of class.

Failure to complete required forms will result in the student being withdrawn from Summer School.

**SUPERVISED HYBRID
ONLINE PROGRAMS**

If cancellation of a traditional course occurs due to insufficient enrollment, students may be offered an opportunity to transfer registration to the LHS online program. This online program allows students to learn in a technologically-enriched environment outside the traditional classroom setting.

The LHS online program is a "hybrid" of supervised onsite and offsite computer-based learning, blended with more traditional assignments, activities, and tests. Our teachers are highly-qualified in their content areas and experienced with digital teaching and learning. Students are required to be present in the computer lab during specified summer school hours on appointed days but are afforded some flexibility in scheduling these mandatory sessions. The computer lab will be available and supervised throughout the summer school program. Certified teachers will be onsite. To insure successful and timely completion of requirements, online students should plan to take advantage of the open lab and available teacher assistance.

Note: Students can register for only one online class, but upon its completion, may register for one additional online class with written approval from our digital teaching and learning coordinators.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

All registrations will first be assigned to traditional classroom courses. Supervised hybrid online programs will be offered where either registration is insufficient to fill and run a traditional class or a licensed teacher is unavailable. This option may not be available for all courses.
